### PROGRAM NEWS

- Celebrated 20 years of GHS with an alumni panel and tribute to co-founder and long-time director, Prof. Bill Leonard. (photos above)
- Hosted Prof. Seye Abimbola from the University of Melbourne, who lectured and taught about reimagining global health equity, as the Second Annual Radulovacki Global Health Visiting Scholar.
- Inaugurated the annual GHS Speaker Series with the generous support of the Provost's Hollister Lecture fund and an Alumnae of Northwestern University Grant, bringing in scholars to share research on topics such as war as a global health threat, experiences of descendants of the USA's last slave ship, AIDS and health in Brazil, and the history of scientific advancements on pandemic influenza.
